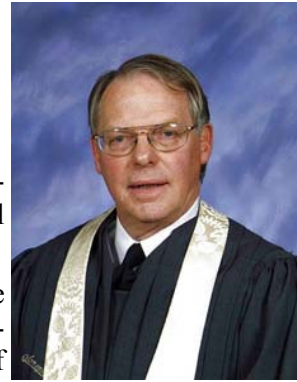

Words from the Associate Minister.....

The Ten Golden Rules of Hospital Calling

When you are in a hospital, a visit from a friend is good medicine. The following common-sense guidelines can help anyone make more effective hospital calls.



1. If the patient's door is closed, knock and ask if you can come in. Look to see if there is a sign on door with special instructions and always follow these instructions. If you have any questions about these instructions, ask a nurse. If you are going in to ICU to see a patient, always stop at the desk and ask a nurse for permission to see the patient. If the patient is alone and appears to be asleep or if the doctor is in the room, do not visit at this time. Come back in 5 or 10 minutes if you can; but see item 6.
2. Hospital visits should never be longer than 10 – 15 minutes. If a person has recently had an operation or seems tired, a 4 to 5 minute visit is long enough.
3. Standing gives the impression that you are in a hurry. Sit down in front of the patient – in a chair or on the side of the bed. Watch out for tubes if you sit on the bed.
4. Touch the patient. Ask if you can hold their hand when you pray or read scripture. Watch out for IV's when holding their hand and don't squeeze their hand.
5. Call the patient by their name at least three times.
6. Leave a card with your name on it in the patient's room when you leave. This is particularly important if you were not able to see the patient because they were asleep.
7. Read scripture – Psalm 23 is always welcomed.
8. Pray for the patient if you feel comfortable doing so. Again, this is a good time to hold the patient's hand.
9. Ask if there is anything you can do for them and ask if there is anything their church can do for them.
10. Be careful of the patient's confidences. If they agree, after making your hospital calls, call the church office or one of the ministers to tell about your visit.

Rules 3, 4 and 5 are often taught to doctors on how to interact with a patient in the hospital.

If you would like to join our caregiver Ministry that makes regular calls on people in the hospital, call the church office.

This last Sunday, June 17th, Melissa Dell ran 56 miles from Durban South Africa to Pietermaritzburg to raise money for EMCOP to be used for the Uros women in programs to promote their culture. The Uros people are the poorest in the Puno area living on floating islands in Lake Titicaca. The islands are made from reeds that are woven and tied under the water. The reeds have to be continually replaced because of the sun and daily use. The Uros people make up a part of the indigenous population of Peru. This group of indigenous people date back to the time of the Incas. Today they rely on money that is made off of tourists buying their hand made trinkets. It is important that these people be able to preserve their heritage and culture. The money that has been donated for Melissa's run will be used for this purpose. Size examples will be available for your viewing in the loggia on Sunday morning.


