## ...According to John



A few years ago the head of the United Church of Christ stated, “This is a great time to be the church!” Such a comment seemed antithetical to the sentiment of the day. Membership was declining. Outreach dollars were shrinking. Most congregations were getting “older,” and there were a lot of wringing of hands. I agreed with the statement then, and I agree with it now. This is a great time to be the church because the future is “wide open”. We, today, are laying the groundwork for the church of the future. It is a wonderful opportunity and a profound challenge.

Many of the titanic churches of days gone by were not able to steer past the unexpected hazards. Yet, they exist, today, only in memory. Some churches have struck the icebergs and are sinking, yet they are futility rearranging the deck chairs in an attempt to stay afloat. Some of the large churches of the post World War II era have become smaller, but are now leaner, more agile, and they are charting new courses to embrace the future. New churches are springing up (particularly among Disciples), yet they look much different than the homogenous, middle class churches that so many of us experienced. In many congregations, worship has a new face. Some congregations are embracing more contemplative experiences. Many are adding instruments and “new” songs. Screens and beautiful visuals are embraced and celebrated in many churches. It is a great time to be the church!

As we add the colors to the portrait of the church of the 21<sup>st</sup> century we must allow God’s spirit to develop the features. I believe it is our task to be streamlined, agile, and receptive; to develop an environment where the “traditional” element is comforted, yet one that is not just traditional; an environment where God calls us to new expressions in worship, ministry, and service, alongside the more familiar. I foresee a church that takes risks, tries new things, experiences failure in some ventures and success in others. I envision a church where there is excitement and hope, where there is an experience of Jesus that the members cannot live without. It’s risky, but worth it.

Central Christian Church has provided an environment for mission and ministry for almost 116 years. Today, we don’t look anything like the church in 1893, 1900, or 1920. But we are still here. Let us work together with God to mold a church for 2010, 2020, & 2030; knowing that it probably won’t look anything like the church today. It is a great time to be the church!

## Do You Use a Room at CCC?

This is a reminder that committees and groups who use rooms at Central Christian Church need to complete a Building Request Form denoting times, dates, requirements and contact persons. This is true for member groups and non-member groups. Those who meet regularly need only to complete one form at the beginning of the year. **UNLESS THERE ARE SPECIFIC ROOM ARRANGEMENTS OR EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR A SPECIFIC MEETING.** In such case a Building Request Form needs to be completed for the specific gathering.

There is a notebook on the receptionist's counter which is to be used for cleaning and maintenance notifications only. Next to the notebook you will find a box with blank Building Request Forms. If your request is for a new meeting, then it will be reviewed and approved by the staff during their weekly meeting on Mondays. If it is for specific room arrangements or equipment for an already scheduled meeting, then, based on availability, no approval is needed.

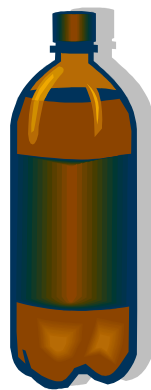
